After working with Comrade Peter over the past two years, understanding the operational structure, and duty of a Legion Member to support the Poppy Campaign I quickly informed Comrade Peter and our Branch Executive my intention to take on the task.

Our annual Poppy Campaign commenced on Friday, October 27th, 2023.Our Branch had table presence at Carl's Independent, NSLC (Wolfville location), The Home Depot, and at the Wolfville Farmer's Market on two Saturdays during the campaign.

Ms. Lynn Beaver assisted again this year coordinating with our schools and promoting the National Youth Remembrance Contest. Five of our comrades assisted with school visits and in addition our Branch was invited to present to the Grade 9 Citizenship Class at Horton High School.

This year we offered two new items to sell at our tables; Indigenous Lapel Pins recognizing the contributions and service of our Indigenous Veterans to the Canadian Armed Forces, and Legion Branch #74 chocolate bars, made locally by Chocolates by Gabrielle in White Rock. The Village of New Minas purchased twenty "We Will Remember Lawn" signs to display throughout the community. Through a social media advertisement on our Branch's Facebook page, we sold



nineteen more signs remaining in inventory from previous year. All three items where very popular requiring additional orders to be placed.

I am very pleased to report Branch #74 raised over \$19,000.00, an historic high for our Legion. This total includes sales from poppies, lapel pins, chocolate bars, lawn signs, and memorial wreaths. These efforts couldn't have happened without the dedication and support of our membership and volunteers. 

It provided a wonderful opportunity to take in the services at the indoor location at University Hall for those that wanted to, or to attend the Outdoor service at the Post Office cenotaph. Both services have a long running tradition of sharing official personnel to bring you the best of two memorable services.

RENO UPDATE BY PAUL MURPHY, 1ST VP

Hello everyone. We have been extremely busy these past 3 months, and the next 3 months will be even busier as we anticipate the completion of the renovations and plans for our Grand Opening.



We completed the drywall, crack fill and 1st coats of paint, installed new heat pumps, duct work and electrical system. Mid-December we installed the front entryway and ramp and the rear concrete walkway. The commercial kitchen, now completed, includes an oven, stove, 2 fryers (one gluten-free), a dishwasher, a single, double and triple sink, new fridge, freezer, stainless steel table and shelving, bar fridges, counter top and cupboards.

In December, 3 volunteer work parties were required, consisting of installing flooring in the office, poppy and comms rooms, transporting major kitchen appliances, tables and chairs for the main level and deck. Thanks to Donn M, Terry B, Brian M, Peter T, John K, Heather K, Gary S, Dale P, Alan B and Paul M.

Final renovations over the next 3 months consist of installing tile and hardwood flooring, an elevator, emergency stairways, deck stairs, final coats of paint, trim

hardwood flooring, an elevator, emergency stairways, deck stairs, final coats of paint, frim work, bathroom and bar fixtures, cabinets, final finishes to the main entryway, internal stairways and the mechanical and electrical systems.



Brooks Levy Construction volunteered his crew to build the curved, live-edge wood bar using the counter top that he cut and dried in his garage for a year. Work began in December and hope to finish it Jan 2024. Thank you, Brooks!

The building, when completed, will house a sports bar in the lower level, our office, a commercial kitchen and bar with a stage on the main level and a counselling room, library, deck, bar, stage, dance floor and Veterans Suite training venue on the upper level featuring

a completely windowed northern view of the Minas Basin and Blomidon. We will have a handicapped-accessible entryway and ramp to both the lower and main levels and all 3 levels have 2 handicapped-accessible washrooms and elevator access. We will host coffees, dinners, card parties, karaoke, dances, music events, fitness classes, dance lessons and rental opportunities for office parties and weddings for the community at large and more.

We have received funding from community groups, the Town of Wolfville, the Municipality of Kings County, the Province of NS and the Federal Government. We still require innovative ways to raise money to pay for the remaining renovations. We recently received a grant from the Eastern Kings Memorial Health Foundation for a defibrillator, 1st aid kits and training and a \$100,000.00 grant from the Federal Government which we will officially announce in 2024.

Our fundraising efforts have raised approx \$160K with the generosity of our members and the communities at large. We realize these are hard times, brought

on by Covid, however if you are able to donate, whether it be \$5 or \$100, it is appreciated. You can still donate three ways. The Newfoundland Regiment 166 and the Royal Canadian Regiment in 1943 sent two fine young men, Harold Cross and Cyril Cross, off to fight during the deep hostilities of WW II in Europe.

After leaving home they lost track of each other as Harold signed up with the RCR in Canada and Cyril signed up for the 166 British Field Regiment.

One evening, Harold the RCR infantry officer undergoing an advance, with artillery cover provided by the 166 was so successful with the barrage laid down, the next morning he went over to the 166 field unit HQ to congratulate and thank the Artillery Officer for the coverage. He was shown into the office and met the greatest surprise of his life. The officer was his brother Cyril.
